Technical ~ ability to apply procedures, techniques and knowledge of computing to solve problems.

Business ~ an understanding of business operations and the ability to “speak the language of business”.

If you choose to continue your education after you graduate from McMurry, you can obtain a master’s or doctoral-level degree in Information Systems or Software Engineering or obtain an MBA and move in to management positions such as Chief Information Officer.

Salaries

Careers in CIS offer some of the highest starting salaries. According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics job prospects for computer-related jobs grew nearly 17% between 1999 and 2005. According to National Association of Colleges and Employers the average starting salaries for CIS graduates was \$47,648.
